12 am A runaway youth is brought to Safe Haven for food, clothing, shelter and support.

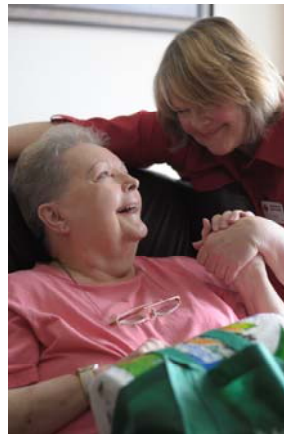
1 am A young wife is checking into Women's Resource Center to escape abuse.
