## **Community Cares COVID-19 Relief Fund**

In March 2020, as the COVID-19 pandemic reached Racine County, United Way of Racine County and the Racine Community Foundation partnered to provide aid to Racine County nonprofits via the <a href="Community Cares COVID-19 Relief Fund">Community Cares awarded a total of 37 grants totaling \$148,395 to 27 local organizations. Community Cares accepted donations through August 31, 2020 and disbursed grants through September 2020.

## **United Way of Racine County COVID Relief Fund**

United Way of Racine County recognized that Racine County residents and the nonprofit sector would need continued support to navigate the pandemic. With this in mind, United Way committed to creating a new COVID Relief Fund. An ad-hoc committee of United Way board members, investment committee members and United Way staff met August-October 2020 to create the framework and application process for this new fund, which <a href="Launched in November 2020">Launched in November 2020</a>. United Way of Racine County thanks committee members Dave Durment, Jim Holland, Kimberly Kane and Steve McLaughlin for their thoughtful contributions to the formation of the fund.

The United Way of Racine County (UWRC) COVID Relief Fund was established to meet the unexpected and immediate needs of the community related to the pandemic. Funding is still available, and grants range from \$2,500 to \$12,000 and are available to any Racine County nonprofit that serves community members and is a registered 501(c)(3). The UWRC COVID Relief Fund is organized to be flexible in addressing the community's changing needs as they evolve throughout this crisis. In particular, the UWRC COVID Relief Fund focuses on the community's areas of greatest need and inequities, such as minority communities that are adversely impacted by COVID-19, areas lacking adequate health care resources and programs that can effectively address immediate areas of community concern – changing quickly as community needs change.

Between December 2020-June 2021, 14 organizations received United Way of Racine County COVID Relief Fund grants totaling \$104,024. An estimated 7,000 community members were impacted by these grants.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, United Way of Racine County has disbursed over 50 grants totaling \$252,419. When combined with two generous donations from the Morgridge Family Foundation, United Way of Racine County's COVID relief grants from the first sixteen months of the pandemic total \$380,619.
