The Youth Group at Emmaus Lutheran Church organized a Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Basket Drive. With a grant from United Way-Youth As Resources and generous contribution of non-perishable goods from Emmaus congregation, they were able to provide 6 food baskets to neighborhood families in need at Thanksgiving and 24 families in need at Christmas time. Gift cards for groceries, and a ham or turkey were also included with the non-perishable items.



Response to Call for Food is Strong

At a time when shelves of the food pantries are bare and more families than ever are in need of assistance, the people of Emmaus are responding generously. The youth group has used a number of grocery bags filled with food to prepare Thanksgiving baskets for five families in need. In addition to non-perishable food items, three turkeys and grocery gift cards have been donated.

On Monday, November 17, representatives of the youth group made a presentation at United Way for a Youth as Resources grant. Provided funds are granted, the youth will prepare an additional twelve baskets to be distributed the weekend before Christmas.

Jhon Freddy Correa and Sandy Strini are organizing the shopping and basket preparation and distribution with the youth. Youth from Lutheran Church of the Redeemer have also been invited to participate in this project.


